

Five Acres Pupil Premium Review 2018/19

Introduced in 2011 the Pupil Premium Grant is a government initiative where schools receive a sum of money to help disadvantaged students. The purpose of this funding is to raise attainment and close the gap between disadvantaged students and their peers.

Aim:

To raise standards in literacy, mathematics, and behaviour to ensure there is progress for all students.

Strategies:

1. The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standard of achievement for these students in English and Maths.
2. Identify any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupils Premium and others and where possible remove these barriers.
3. Raise aspirations of students who are eligible for the Pupil Premium.
