Our Character Education programme helps our students to develop ambition through the extended opportunities provided by Five Acres High School, including taking part in different events such as visiting colleges and universities through the Scholars Programme Brilliant Club and our Excellence Pathways Programme. This provides students with the opportunity to gain knowledge about future options and career pathways once they leave Five Acres High School.

A successful careers programme, including one-to-one careers advice, throughout Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 has helped to shape students' character and their ambitious aims.

We create opportunities for students to taste success through a residential experience in Year 7, participating in individual, small group or whole school performances, involvement in the Brilliant Club, and holding a formal interview process for our Student Leadership Team and Character Education leads.

At Five Acres High School all students are encouraged to be part of the school community, and have the opportunity to participate in decisions that shape the way their school life develops through student voice forums and student surveys.

Confidence and leadership can be achieved not only through team sports (representing house groups or the school) but also taking part in academic competitions such as the UK Mathematics Trust annual challenge, as well as numerous other internal and external events.

On joining Five Acres High School, all Year 7 students are encouraged to participate in an overnight residential course, this promotes teamwork, leadership skills and builds individual character. Throughout school life, there are also regular day trips and multiple overnight excursions both in the UK as well as abroad, which help students to gain independence and self-belief.

Every morning, students are transported to far distant lands, contrasting cultures and back and forth in time, to worlds populated by a myriad of intriguing and fascinating characters through the Tutor Time Reading Programme. Sharing books in this way helps build students' own personal canon, be involved in a shared reading experience and gain insight into personal and universal issues that will only arm them better to make sense of the world around them.

The passion we instil in our students for reading and the power it gives them is harnessed and developed through daily DEAR time reading (Drop Everything And Read), supported by a wonderful library, which not only offers a brilliant choice of quality fiction, but is also stocked with books from the Greenshaw Canon, a diet of challenging texts for students to consume in order to achieve a coveted Character Education award for Determination in Literacy.

Five Acres High School students are also offered the chance to become part of one of the hugely successful book societies, who meet regularly to discuss, debate, deconstruct, analyse and opine about great literature before sharing their passion with their peers through assemblies. Furthermore, students support each other in their reading through Reading Buddies because here, reading is supported at every level.

At Five Acres High School, we know that reading is a life skill which unlocks the curriculum, creating a foundation for lifelong learning and nourishes the souls of our students, creating empathetic, compassionate and fully rounded young people.

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At Five Acres High School we offer a world-class, broad and balanced curriculum. Students from Five Acres High School have taken part in many local and national competitions, achieving a high level of success. Recent years have seen our boys football team progress to the semi-final of the National Schools FA Cup, and more locally our rugby players reached the semifinal of the EDF Cup, organized by Gloucester Rugby Club. We have also claimed many county titles in sports ranging from mountain biking to boccia, and have been District Champions and County runners-up.

As part of the Greenshaw Learning Trust we are able to compete against our fellow GLT schools. Five Acres High School students took home wins in the latest Greenshaw Learning Trust Rugby Cups in Years 7, 8 and 9 and have won the Greenshaw Learning Trust Athletics Championships three times in a row.

Locally, we are very competitive and are usually the favourites to win our fixtures. We are not defined by these successes, we also place great emphasis on the participation alone. We look to engage as many students as possible.

We have links with Gloucester Rugby Club, Rugby Football Union, Cheltenham Town FC, Bells Golf Club, Rockets Health & Fitness Club, Gloucestershire Cricket Board, Lyndean Netball Club, Hartpury University and Hartpury College and the University of Gloucestershire (School of Sport and Exercise) and are always looking to add to our links with other local and national clubs.

Being a part of a world-class curriculum in Music, students at Five Acres High School study a range of musical styles, within the genres of Classical, World and Popular music, engaging through composition, performance, listening and appraising, using industry standard software, and a range of musical instruments.

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Students learn to play musical instruments, from peripatetic music tuition, delivered by professional musicians, to engaging in extra-curricular activities. Societies such as A Capella, student chamber choir, band and other instrumental groups, cultivate and enhance musical literacy, build friendships and professional relationships through ensemble work, and give students the opportunity to perform and express their enthusiasm for music. Students are also given the exciting opportunity to play with working musicians and professionals, both in Year 8 Orchestra, fronted by instrumentalists from Gloucestershire Music, and whole year-group choir once a fortnight in Key Stage 3. This culminates in experiences of performing with other ensembles in our sister schools across the Greenshaw Learning Trust.

Creative staff are dedicated to ensuring that our students have the opportunity to experience playing to a wider audience, through in-house and public productions and concerts, and foreign tours, especially with our links to St Hillaire de Riez, France through the Coleford Twinning Association. Students develop as musicians and establish and reinforce life-long skills and disciplines which will serve them well throughout their educational and working careers.

Homework forms an integral part of a student's daily routine at Five Acres High School. As a school we place huge importance on homework and the advantages that it brings to our students in terms of increasing their chances of success.

Homework provides all students with the opportunity to work independently towards their own goals and successes. Along the way students will develop the skills of determination, commitment and resilience, alongside the attributes of good time management and recognising the importance of meeting deadlines. Once mastered, these skills stay with our students for life and are transferable into the world of work.

Our homework model is built upon the basics of reading and mathematics and the regular retrieval of information applied through deliberate practice tasks, such as self-quizzing. As students move into Key Stage 4 a more bespoke set of homework tasks are added to the basics to help students develop a revision programme, giving them a better chance of success.

We offer our students a supportive model for the completion of their homework. We run a targeted study support model, supported by our teaching assistants, which helps our most vulnerable students meet the demands of the homework model. We also offer Study Support, where students can opt to use our facilities to complete their work before going home; this is a popular option for those students who need help with their time management.

At Five Acres High School the students see a real value and impact of the homework they complete, and this is evidenced through the high completion rate and positive feedback that we receive from our students and parents.



Primarily, Five Acres High School provides interventions, both in small groups or one-to-one, in a wide range of study skills. We pride ourselves in supporting students with social, emotional and academic needs in a safe and supportive environment, helping them reach their ambitions.

Our diverse and inclusive curriculum has seen our students perform at county level in both boccia and cricket, gaining respect from the entire school community.

Our mutual respect and trusted relationships with both our students and their families underpin all of the core values of Five Acres High School.

Alongside our inspiring Literacy and Numeracy interventions, we continually hold mind mapping, reading, touch typing and community engagement programmes, ensuring every student has the opportunity to achieve their best.

Assisting students is imperative; our department regularly supplies a host of learning aids, such as handwriting pens, adapted booklets, coloured papers and reader pens as well as providing bespoke learning courses to suit individual needs.

Five Acres High School SEN department staff are dedicated and proud of their individual Continual Professional Development through attending workshops, online courses and studying university degrees to enhance their understanding of specific learning difficulties, such as autism, dyslexia, dyscalculia and speech and language and mental health. We are also privileged to have Teaching Assistants qualified in delivering yoga sessions in school and a trained speech, language and communications intervention lead.

Applying a holistic approach to support students across the key stages of their development, we regularly involve internal and external agencies to guide them through their journey at Five Acres High School. Our main objective is to instill confidence, to enable all our students to be ambitious and successful in their post-16 pathways.

E FUN FRIDAYS

Fun Friday is a huge part of the Five Acres High School life, and is something that all year groups can take part in. Having fun together develops deep relationships and togetherness and supports all students and staff in being part of our brilliant community. It plays a central role in helping us to understand and appreciate each other. We run numerous competitions throughout the year from Halloween bake sales to designing the school Christmas Card in December. Students taking part can gain house points or even vouchers to celebrate their individual successes. At the end of each term house points are added up and students in the winning house share together in an awesome treat.

Through Fun Fridays, an atmosphere of creativity, ambition and excitement is created here at Five Acres High School. Every week there are different competitions that celebrate everyone's strengths. Staff are also celebrated through our Fun Friday awards. Nominations are received for those who go above and beyond to reflect our school values— Ambition, Confidence, Creativity, Determination and Respect.

We have four houses named after birds of prey that can be seen in our local area: Hawk, Owl, Peregrine and Kestrel.

Each student is placed in a house when they join the school and encouraged to take part in competitions throughout the year. As we are part of the Greenshaw Learning Trust, we have run many competitions nationwide with students from all around the country taking part.

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CHARACTER EDUCATION & EXCELLENCE PATHWAY

Our Character Education offer sits alongside our existing brilliant academic offer to ensure that students have access to a wide and balanced range of experiences throughout their time at school, giving them the opportunity to develop and embed our five core values of Ambition, Confidence, Creativity, Determination and Respect.

Students have opportunities to take part in a range of activities and experiences through their five years at Five Acres High School. For example enjoying residential trips and theatre visits, watching live sporting events, respecting the environment, or being members of the student council or Student Leadership Team. We feel that having access to these life experiences is just as important as academic success.

Each experience or activity will count towards being awarded a shield in one of our five core values For example, to achieve Bronze in Adventure, students need to complete a residential school trip. To achieve Gold, they need to have completed either their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award, or the Ten Tors Challenge.

We recently launched our Platinum Character Champion accreditation, which has been created to recognise students' exceptional levels of commitment and achievement in relation to character, support student development as a flourishing young person and support in the preparation for the next steps they will take in education and the world of work.



Our Excellence Pathway is a bespoke programme where students can explore culture, develop academically and become determined and ambitious individuals. This pathway is designed to ensure that students' academic gifts are nurtured, developed and embraced with passion, determination and resilience by themselves and those that surround them. Students have the knowledge of evidence based learning strategies and are therefore able to create ambitious goals for the future. This nurturing accelerates the pace of learning, fosters extremely high expectations and promotes independent thinking and learning.

We endeavour to develop student cultural capital by encouraging a love and passion for the Arts. We offer opportunities for students to visit museums, galleries and theatres to immerse themselves in a new culture. In addition, select sessions endeavour to engage students in 'Current Affairs' and contribute respectfully and confidently in discussions. Through knowledge of the wider world we foster respectfulness and inclusivity.

With our small group sessions, we also expose students to 'superheroes' who are in fact relatively ordinary people who have made themselves extraordinary. This builds student confidence and respect as they explore the world around them.
