HOW TO USE FLASHCARDS EFFECTIVELY

Retrieval practice is a really effective way to revise. This is a revision strategy where students actively test their memory, rather than re-reading or highlighting. This makes the memory stronger for students so they can recall that information confidently and quickly. All students in Years 10 and 11 have been given a pack of flashcards to take away with them to aid their studies, this is a fun and active way to use retrieval practice and test memory.

What makes a good flashcard?

Flashcards are quick fire questions written on small pieces of card. They should have a question on one side, and an answer on another. The best flashcards have small amounts of information with specific questions. Varying the question starters (what, why, who, when, explain) can mean that students are using different skills, not just information recall.


How can I help?

Flashcards and quizzing are brilliant ways to get involved in your child's revision. Although the making of flashcards is important, quizzing using the flashcards is the most powerful revision. You can use these cards as games at home with the family or quiz on a regular basis as a habit.

Everything Everything by Nicola Yoon



My disease is as rare as it is famous. It's a form of Severe Combined Immunodeficiency, but basically, I'm allergic to the world. I don't leave my house, have not left my house in 15 years. The only people I ever see are my mom and my nurse, Carla.

But then one day, a moving truck arrives. New next door neighbours. I look out the window, and I see him. He's tall, lean and wearing all black—black t-shirt, black jeans, black sneakers and a black knit cap

that covers his hair completely. He catches me looking and stares at me. I stare right back. His name is Olly. I want to learn everything about him, and I do. I learn that he is funny and fierce. I learn that his eyes are Atlantic Ocean-blue and that his vice is stealing silverware. I learn that when I talk to him, my whole world opens up, and I feel myself starting to change—starting to want things. Maybe we can't predict the future, but we can predict some things. For example, I am certainly going to fall in love with Olly. It's almost certainly going to be a disaster.

The Midnight Library by Matthew Haig

Between life and death there is a library, and within that library, the shelves go on forever. Every book provides a chance to try another life you could have lived. To see how things would be if you had made other choices... Would you have done anything different, if you had the chance to undo your regrets?

A dazzling novel about all the

choices that go into a life well lived, from the internationally bestselling author of *Reasons to Stay Alive* and *How To Stop Time*.

Somewhere out beyond the edge of the universe there is a library that contains an infinite number of books, each one the story of another reality. One tells the story of your life as it is, along with another book for the other life you could have lived if you had made a different choice at any point in your life. Would any of these other lives truly be better?

In Matt Haig's enchanting new novel, Nora Seed finds herself faced with this decision. Faced with the possibility of changing her life for a new one, following a different career, undoing old breakups, realising her dreams of becoming a glaciologist; she must search within herself as she travels through the Midnight Library to decide what is truly fulfilling in life, and what makes it worth living in the first place.
