# **MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER**

Welcome to the first newsletter for this half term. Students are working hard to show off their skills and talents in their Spring assessments, we look forward to sharing the results of these assessments towards the end of the term and celebrating the progress made.

Progress in assessments and development of children's character has been proven to be adversely affected by poor attendance. The Government definition of persistent absence is any child who has an absence at least once a fortnight. We want to continue encouraging you to prioritise attendance at all stages of education because of the effect of cumulative days missed can be considerable. We understand that there are times when attendance is disrupted due to other circumstances. This is a good time to remind you about our earlier correspondence giving details of upcoming industrial action days. Can I thank all of you who have navigated some difficult weather conditions this week to ensure your child can benefit from the excellent education we provide.

We are always looking for ways to overcome difficulties that arise and barriers that hold students back. Our emphasis on reading, Character Education and performance alongside our drive for academic achievement ensures that students have a better chance of success.

On the subject of success, we were proud to learn that since September, our students have completed a huge 1,290,556 questions for Sparx Maths - this is a fantastic achievement. Also, a number of our students have been recognised for their hard work through Bedrock Learning, earning certificates for literacy excellence. We are excited to launch the next level of our Character Education offer this term – Platinum. This will be available to students in Years 9, 10 and 11 and provide an opportunity to recognise those students who show exceptional levels of commitment and achievement in relation to character. We are very proud of our girls football and boys handball teams who were crowned champions this week.



Shortly we will be starting the Student Leadership Team application process for head students and Character Education leads for the next academic year. Further details will be provided after the Easter break for students who will be entering Years 10 and 11 in September.

We continue to build on our rewards system with the successful launch of our birthday tie initiative and investing in additional equipment for students to use during break and lunchtimes to ensure that all of our students continue to thrive during their time with us. We've had some strong attendance from KS3 this term, Y9 have shown some big improvements in particular. Year 9 have also cut their negative behaviour logs by a third when you compare last term to term 2 before Christmas. This positive step in attendance and behaviour shows that Y9 are ready to fulfil their options. A reminder that the deadline for

It has been a busy couple of weeks for Year 10 and 11, completing their assessments. Year 11s have now finished their final PPEs, meaning the next time they sit exams it will be for their official GCSEs. We have been really impressed with the maturity students have shown throughout the process and these preparations have been a great success. There will be an opportunity for Year 11s to attend revision and coursework sessions over the Easter break. A timetable will be shared with you shortly. Next week, Year 11 students will also be receiv-



For the next round of assessments in the summer, Year 10 will begin to prepare for their GCSEs by sitting these in the exam hall. Our Year 10s have several futures events planned this term to look forward to, including workshops for those considering business management or systems engineering, as well as some inspirational talks from previous students.



"I am restless, my feet need to fly."


Amber is trapped - by her father's rules, by his expectations, by her own fears. Now she's ready to fight - for her mother, for her sister, for herself.
