MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

This week we took delivery of new table football tables and benches. Our Year 10 Business, Economic and Engineering students had a great start to this term with a workshop provided by staff at GE Aerospace (two of whom are also past Five Acres High School students). GE is a world leading provider of jet and turboprop engines. The students designed and created their own model planes, having to work within a budget and then competed against each other for flying effectiveness, speed and aesthetics. It was a fantastic opportunity for our students to put the many skills they have learnt in their studies to the

test, as well as gain an insight into the opportunities available to them for the future. GE also spoke to the year group about the various roles within the company and apprenticeship opportunities. It was fantastic to see so many Year 11 students attending the half term revision and coursework sessions offered, demonstrating their dedication to giving themselves the best chance of success. 
CORONATION CELEBRATIONS

Our Reading Programme Lead, Miss Phelps shares her picks for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4.




Chinese Cinderella by Adeline Yen Mah

Chinese Cinderella is an autobiography for children based on the bestselling Falling Leaves by Adeline Yen Mah.

Jung-ling's family considers her bad luck because her mother died giving birth to her. They discriminate against her and make her feel unwanted yet she yearns and strives for her parents' love. Her stepmother is vindictive and cruel and her father dismissive. Jung-ling grows

up to be an academic child, with a natural ability for writing. Only her aunt and grandfather offer her any love and kindness. The the crown of England is won by story is of survival in the light of the mental and physical cruelty of her stepmother and the disloyalty for agreeing to marry a man old of her siblings. Jung-ling blossoms in spite of everything and the story ends as her father agrees to let her study in England.

LoveReading4Kids described the book as 'a unique story of triumph over adversity, told against the background of the Nationalist/Communist struggle for control of China.'



The Boleyn Inheritance by Philippa Gregory

The year is 1539 and the court of Henry VIII is increasingly fearful of the moods of the ageing sick king. With only a baby in the cradle for an heir, Henry has to take another wife and the dangerous prize of Anne of Cleves.

She has her own good reasons enough to be her father, in a country where to her both language and habits are foreign.

Although fascinated by the glamour of her new surroundings, she senses a trap closing around her. Katherine Howard is confident that she can follow in the steps of her cousin Anne Boleyn to dazzle her way to the throne but her kinswoman Jane Boleyn, haunted by the past, knows that Anne's path led to Tower Green and to an adulterer's death.

The story of these three young women, trying to make their own way through the most volatile court in Europe at a time of religious upheaval and political uncertainty, is Philippa Gregory's most compelling novel yet.





STUDENT SURVEY RESULTS

Towards the end of last term, students had the opportunity to contribute to the development of our school by completing our annual student survey. Like all stakeholder voice, it enables them to give honest feedback about their day-to-day experiences, covering a range of topics, from our Character Education Programme, The Tutor Reading Programme and careers support.

We are really pleased that the majority of our students would recommend Five Acres High School to a friend and there is a really clear sense of what most students believe our strengths are:

- 89% of students across all year groups either strongly agree or agree that they are encouraged to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally.
- 88% of YR7s-YR10s strongly agree or agree that the books they read expose them to a range of time periods, cultures and protected characteristics.
- 86% of students feel that they understand our five core values and how to show them in school and in the local community.
- 84% of YR11s strongly agree or agree that they know what revision strategies they need to use to revise.
- 81% of YR11s strongly agree or agree that TTRP and DEAR interventions are effective in supporting their progress.
- 83% of students across all year groups either strongly agree or agree that they are encouraged to be independent and to take on responsibilities.
- 81% of YR11s strongly agree or agree that they are happy with the revision support they have received this year.

We have already started to respond to the areas our students would like to see improvements in. It was clear that they wanted more to do during social times so we have invested in more benches, football and table tennis tables, which are being delivered soon. Board and card games are now also available in the quad at lunchtime and it's been fantastic to see them being enjoyed by so many already. We will also continue to work on our school value of respect to promote kindness to everyone across our community through explicit modelling and whole year group messages to ensure all feel a sense of belonging to our wonderful school.
