As usual over the holiday period there have been a number of improvements to the school site including more outdoor games and activities for social times, an upgrade in our internet servers, a redecoration of key classrooms and much more. This continued investment alongside a full


MOUNTAIN BIKE RACE WINNER

UPDATES FROM HEADS OF KEY STAGES

MR HAYWARD - HEAD OF KEY STAGE 3

Year 7 students have made a great start to secondary school with a smooth transition for the majority. It is great to see Year 7 growing in confidence as the days go by as they begin to learn their way around the school and get to know their teachers. The best part is watching new friendships start, some of these friendships will last a lifetime and they are starting right now, which is awesome.

Year 8 and Year 9 have made a strong start back after the holidays. All three year groups are showing really strong attendance, with nearly every student in 100% correct uniform with the right equipment, ready to learn. We have introduced a new system where tokens are handed out to celebrate when a student does something positive or works hard. In the first three days alone over 350 were given out, the majority of these to Key Stage 3 students. This further demonstrates the excellent start that they have made.

A couple of housekeeping notes for the new term, all the information for new academies and societies have been given out and these academies and societies have begun. School sports fixtures have already begun, students who are involved will be given the relevant details.

As a reminder to students and parents the structure of the pastoral side of the school in Key Stage 3 is as follows: I am now Head of Year 7, 8 and 9 and Head of PE. Mrs Toulson is the Pastoral lead for Years 7, 8 and 9 and Mrs Walters is Year 7 Pastoral Support and the second contact for Year 7s after tutors, as Mrs Walters has overseen the transitions from primary schools. For any pastoral concerns, please contact your child's tutor in the first instance, as they will see your child on the most regular basis and will be able to build effective and supportive relationships.

What a superb start to the new academic year for KS4. Our Year 11s have hit the ground running and are full of positivity.
