MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Welcome to the latest edition of the Five Acres High School newsletter. I would like to start by thanking you all for your cooperation during our water shortage last week. Your efficiency in collecting students was impressive. I am glad that everything has now been restored and we can continue to focus on teaching and learning.

Over the next week or so you may hear sound bites from our politicians about the direction of education, for example the Education Secretary this week has made mention about guidance on mobile phone use within school and the Prime Minister has mentioned a potential shake up in post-16 qualifications. I want to say that no matter what the next big idea is, we will always strive to ensure that our offer is exceptional and is rooted in the latest guidance and evidence. On the subject of mobile phones, you will know that we have a policy which restricts access during the day. We will be tightening our guidance to students around their use at the end of the day and giving clarity

on where they can be used once school is finished. We would appreciate it if you could use the recognised forms of communication (via email to subject teachers or email and phone call to reception) should you wish to contact your child during the school day to help avoid any confusing messages.

Setting high standards is important to us because it helps to ensure that the messages that we give are clear and precise; we invest a lot of time in thinking about how we can help students be successful and the kindest thing that we can do for them is to be clear. Our high standards are often a feature of conversations with new parents who come to look around the school. They are appreciative of the environment that this allows, especially the disruption-free learning, which ensures every student is given an opportunity to learn and excel. Recently we have welcomed in 100s of parents and children during our Open Evening and School in Action days. Our visitors are always keen to congratulate our students on their



behaviour, their engagement in activities throughout the school and the way they enthusiastically talk about their experiences here.

This week sees the first of three groups of our Year 7 students visiting Viney Hill. I hope they have a brilliant time and that the weather is kind to them. During this time I am sure they will make good friends and begin to develop the values that are so important to us. On page 4 is an example of what can be achieved when students are committed to achieving personal success. I congratulate Josh and Anastasia on being the first students to achieve this accolade. I hope you all have a fantastic weekend.


Ava is taking part in the Spanish Language challenge to celebrate the European Day of Languages. Here she is displaying her cooking skills with her Spanish omelette.

Our Reading Programme Lead, Miss Phelps shares her picks for Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4.



The Skylarks' War by Hilary McKay

Clarry and her brother Peter live for their annual summer trips to Cornwall – a chance not only to escape their apathetic father, but to experience the joy of exploring nature with their cousin Rupert. But when the First World War begins and Rupert enlists in the army, their world is thrown upside down – will they ever see him again? And how will the shadow of conflict change their lives?

The Skylarks' War is a triumph of a book, managing to simultaneously be small-scale while encompassing huge themes of war, love, sexism and family. Every single word is carefully chosen by Hilary McKay, resulting in some incredible passages that will stop you in your tracks. The descriptions of life on the front are hugely evocative and brutal, skilfully portraying the horrors of war while never being too violent for young readers. But the effects of the war are felt by the characters who stay in England, too, from one girl's new life as a nurse to the impact of food shortages. The Skylarks' War will transport you into Clarry and Peter's lives, following them all the way from childhood mishaps to adult decisions.



Boys Don't Cry by Malorie Blackman

This is the explosively pageturning novel for teenagers from the author of the award-winning Noughts and Crosses sequence. You're about to receive your Alevel results and then a future of university and journalism awaits. But the day they're due to arrive your old girlfriend Melanie turns up unexpectedly... with a baby. You assume Melanie's helping a friend, until she nips out to buy some essentials, leaving you literally holding the baby.

Malorie's dramatic new novel will keep you on the edge of your seat right to the final page.

The Guardian describes it as "An extraordinary book, and truly is Malorie Blackman at her best". The Times review includes: "Blackman's emotional intelligence is such that Boys Don't Cry should be read aloud in every secondary school."

Nick said, "It still amazes me how few people in our town recognise the Great Western Air Ambulance Charity as our local air ambulance, and the aim of my fundraising this year is to help raise awareness of this. Around 80% of all HEMS (Helicopter Emergency Medicine Service) calls to Gloucestershire are responded to by GWAAC, with the other 20% covered by 4 or 5 other air ambulance charities.
