MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

As this term draws to a close, I would like to start by thanking you for your support and commitment to ensuring that your child has a better chance of success by attending Five Acres High School. This has been an excellent term, with so many students achieving brilliant outcomes (Year 7, 9 and 11) and Character Education badges. I have also been delighted to see a huge increase in the number of tokens and postcards being distributed as students show their excellence in lessons and around the school.

This term has been a challenging term for whole school attendance and whilst our figures are in line with national data, I know we are capable of so much more. Last year's Year 11 students have shown that excellent attendance and being in lessons on time are the biggest indicator of sustained academic progress. Whilst we have a number of initiatives running in school to encourage good attendance, such as the In It To Win It daily draws and the Champions League competition, we also want to continue to work with parents to develop good

habits around attendance as we know these habits transfer into post-16 and employment opportunities.

With the term extending deep into December, we will ensure that we will finish on a high and want all students to benefit from the expert-led lessons, celebration opportunities and festive activities. Attending every day will ensure that your child does not miss out. Our festive activities include the design a Christmas Card competition, which has been won by Chloe (Year 11), a remarkable fifth triumph in a row. We have also continued to support the Forest Foodbank appeal, your response has been excellent so far and we look forward to receiving your donations as part of our Christmas Jumper (Tie & Socks) Day on Wednesday 20 December. On this day we will also serve traditional Christmas lunch in the canteen and all week there will be a special Christmas menu.

I have also been delighted to see the take up of the free porridge offer over recent weeks. We plan to continue this into the new year. We have also committed



to opening the canteen at 3pm and 4pm to allow students to buy drinks and snacks as they leave their lessons and after school activities.




When Life Gives You Mangoes by Kereen Getten

The story is about a young girl who can't remember anything from her previous summer after a hurricane.

Twelve-year-old Clara lives on an island that visitors call exotic. But there's nothing exotic about it to Clara. She loves eating ripe mangoes off the ground, running outside in the rain with her Papa during the rainy season, and going to her secret hideout with Gaynah - even though lately she's not acting like a best friend. The only thing out of the ordinary for Clara is that something happened to her memory that made her forget everything that happened last summer after a hurricane hit. Sometimes things come back to her in drips

like a tap that hasn't been turned off properly. Other times her Mama fills in the blanks... Only she knows those aren't her memories and it is hard feeling like she is not like everybody else. But this summer is going to be different for Clara. Everyone is buzzing with excitement over a new girl in the village who is not like other visitors. She is about to make big waves on the island - and give Clara a summer she won't forget.



The Keeper of Lost Things by Ruth Hogan

Anthony Peardew is the keeper of lost things. Forty years ago, he carelessly lost a keepsake from his beloved fiancée, Therese. That very same day, she died unexpectedly. Brokenhearted, Anthony sought consolation in rescuing lost objects—the things others have dropped, misplaced, or accidentally left behind—and writing stories about them. Now, in the twilight of his life, Anthony worries

that he has not fully discharged his duty to reconcile all the lost things with their owners. As the end nears, he bequeaths his secret life's mission to his unsuspecting assistant, Laura, leaving her his house and all its lost treasures, including an irritable ghost.

Recovering from a bad divorce, Laura moves into his mansion, her life begins to change. She finds a new friend in the neighbour's quirky daughter, Sunshine, and a welcome distraction in Freddy, the rugged gardener. As the dark cloud engulfing her lifts, Laura, accompanied by her new companions, sets out to realise Anthony's last wish: reuniting his cherished lost objects with their owners.

Long ago, Eunice found a trinket on the London pavement and kept it through the years. Now, with her own end drawing near, she has lost something precious—a tragic twist of fate that forces her to break a promise she once made. As the Keeper of Lost Objects, Laura holds the key to Anthony and Eunice's redemption. But can she unlock the past and make the connections that will lay their spirits to rest?
