## MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. With the half term break now on us, I wish you all a good rest and look forward to welcoming your child back to school on Monday 19 February.

Whilst the term has been very short we have still managed to pack a lot in. We continue to be impressed with student attitudes to learning and towards personal development. It has been a joy to hear over 350 badges or shields have been awarded this term as part of our Character Education programme, as well as multiple students signing up to work towards their Platinum shields. I look forward to sharing details of their finished projects with you all in due course.

Over the last term, we have talked about the conditions that allow students and staff to be successful at Five Acres High School, and two of these conditions have included supporting students through high expectations and ensuring that students are in school and in lessons a maximum amount of time. Standards are important because they allow students to know what is expected and how

to get things right. Today we are rewarding multiple students across every year group for the completion of the term with no Standards Card strikes. We also very much enjoy being able to issue tokens on a weekly basis for students who continue to get things right at every opportunity.

Attendance continues to hit the headlines and it continues to be a concern for us at Five Acres. When students attend school not only do they receive expert-led education they can also take advantage of the multiple areas of support on offer and they can access more opportunities to build their character.

With Year 11 exams currently happening as they work towards their final exams it is once again worth mentioning the correlation between student attendance and outcomes. When students attend less than 96% of the time, their grades are hit on average by around half a grade, for students who attend less than 80% of the time (one day a week absence) grades, on average, are affected by 1.5 grades. The gap in attainment is even more evident where attendance has been low



throughout a student's school career. Whilst we understand that there are always occasions where absence cannot be helped, we want to ensure that we do everything to support good attendance and better outcomes, and we encourage all families to have a similar mindset.






The Blackthorn Branch

### MR JONES - HEAD OF YEAR 7



It has been a short, sharp but smashing half term for Year 7 students at Five Acres High School. A special shout-out goes to all the Year 7 students who performed in the Shakespeare Showcase last week and who sang in the Coleford Music Memory Choir this week. Mr Williamson and Mr Brinson have been beaming about the acting and singing talent in Year 7!

Year 7s have increased their haul of Character Education badges this term and with now 146 badges awarded over the year 7DWN have recently

overtaken 7APZ (129 badges to date). Year 7 attendance continues to hold up well - despite some recent illness floating around. We are currently at 94.56% as a year group. 7SPE and 7JWS (both on 96% for this term) are currently battling it out in our latest attendance competition The Weakest Link. Year 7s were awarded 428 positive behaviour points last week with Chloe (7SPE) topping the charts with a whopping 14 personal positive behaviour points.

The Year 9 options evening was really well attended and we hope that parents/carers and students found this useful, and thank you to all those who attended Year 9 Parents' Evening, which I hope will have supported students in making their option choices.
