Escaping war is only half the battle as the Kovalenko family swap Ukrainian dangers for life with a British family.



The next thing you know, you're in the future. Being shot at for being out after curfew. You don't even recognise your hometown. And you're heading for a confrontation from your worst nightmare.


What if you could change the

#### MR JONES - HEAD OF YEAR 7



Another short sharp term in which Year 7s have shown some serious success starting with year to date attendance at 94.7%, making them the top year group in the school!
