## MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. Year 11 students will shortly be embarking on their first written exams of the GCSE season, and I wish them all the best as they navigate the number of exams, approximately 20 per student, they will be undertaking. Students who have completed coursework, art practical, photography practical and speaking exams to date have performed excellently and I look forward to sharing news of their successes over the coming months.

Academic outcomes are one of our key indicators of success, and this sits alongside our commitment to helping students develop their character. In this edition, you will see many examples of where students continue to excel in this area - those who are awarded their Character Education badges and shields in school and those who are proud to let us know of their achievements outside of school (Year 8 student Willow). I congratulate all of these students on the efforts that they make to engage in the wider life of the school.

I am also very proud of the students that represent the school in fixtures, on trips and visits and at local events. We were particularly excited to hear of the Excellence Pathway visit to the Houses of Parliament that some Y8 and 10 students participated in. The Houses of Parliament give the 650 MPs the opportunity to represent their constituents. In the next few days we will be choosing new student leaders who will be representing the school as they enter Year 11, and I warmly congratulate those students from our current Year 8 and 9 who will be representing our five values of Ambition, Confidence, Creativity, Determination and Respect as Character Education Leads and Deputies. We are currently working on a more detailed plan for how we can encourage all students to have more of a voice and a say in some of the issues that are important to them. Hearing the voice of the child is a key improvement

for us this year and we will shortly be running the student survey, where each student will be encouraged to provide their views. I would like to thank you as parents for the response you gave to our recent parent



survey, where 92% of you agreed that your child feels safe at this school, 93% agree that the school communicates effectively about opportunities and 97% of you support our emphasis on reading. Over the coming weeks we will give further information on the full results of the survey through posts on our social media pages and references in newsletters and other communications.

Sitting alongside our drive to hear the voice of students and see them involved in the wider life of school we have committed to ensuring that lesson time is maximised. This term's attendance has started very strongly, particularly in Years 8 and 11 where we regularly see attendance at over 95%. Thank you for the part that you play in ensuring that students attend school promptly, in the correct uniform and fully equipped to learn. We know that when students are in school and start their day well, following their morning greeting checks, they develop a better sense of purpose, meaning and belonging.

This term is one of the shortest that we have ever known, standing at just 19 school days, therefore our next newsletter will be issued at the beginning of the next new term when our attention will turn to welcoming Year 6 students who will be joining us in September, sports days, school productions, end of year assessments and so much more. Thank you for your continued support and interest in the school.

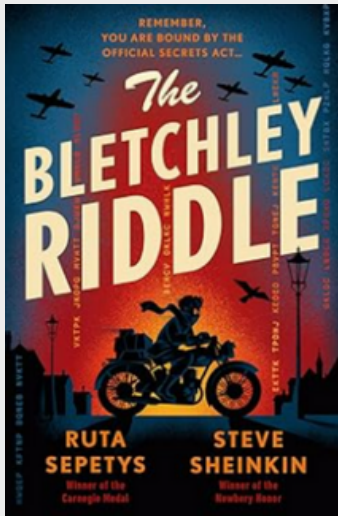
More recently, Willow brought home **seven** medals from competitions held in Reading and she will be taking part in championship finals in May held in the iconic Blackpool Tower ballroom.

Remember, you are bound by the official secrets act... It is the summer of 1940. The world is at war. These days, you don't know who you can trust or who might be a secret spy...

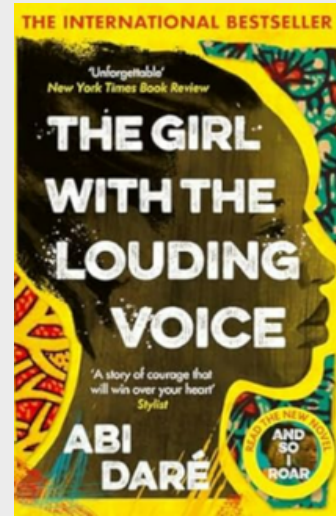

Congratulations to the students who were awarded a **Golden Ticket** and celebrated Afternoon Tea with Mr Phelps.

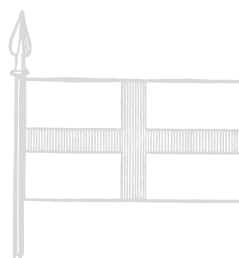
Their hard work, kindness and determination has paid off!
