Here at Five Acres High School, we are striving to create a world class Music Hub here in the Forest, and in order to do this, not only will you have both music lessons and choir on your timetables, but will also be given the opportunity to work with dedicated peripatetic instrumental and vocal teachers, who are either freelance or are provided through Gloucestershire Music.

It stimulates the brain and improves memory and abstract reasoning skills, which are particularly important for Maths and Science. It helps to give you a sense of achievement and builds confidence, whilst helping to improve your patience, ability and confidence. Making music enhances your memory, your self-discipline and time management. It can also make you more creative, which is essential in all subjects.

Playing any instrument sharpens fine motor skills and improves hand/eye co-ordination and has benefits on your health and well-being. It allows a student to be part of a social group, either at home or with other musicians.

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Mr Steve Barnett - Drums:

Steve started playing percussion at the age of nine and coming from a musical family, it was inevitable that this would be the path that he would follow.

His ability to play many differing musical styles from rock to jazz, orchestral to big band, led to him becoming principal percussionist with one of the world's leading brass bands, the Tredegar Band, where for the past twelve years he has been an integral part of the bands most successful ever period in its rich history. This has included performing and recording many times for CDs, radio, TV and film and winning many major championship titles along the way.

Steve has also performed in many top concert halls in the UK and Europe, plus embarked on tours of South Africa and Lithuania, to name a few.

In his spare time, Steve manufactures his own range of percussion instruments and drum kits.

He has now been teaching at Five Acres for the last ten years, and thoroughly enjoys working with the students there.

He is a professional singer and composer, mainly working as member of the Cathedral Choir in Gloucester. He currently provides singing lessons at Archway School in Stroud, as well as privately and works with pupils from beginner to diploma level.

He aims to structure lessons to meet the individual aims of his pupils, working with pieces across a range of styles, and has helped pupils prepare for both vocal and school examinations. He am fully DBS cleared with C1 safeguarding training through the Diocese of Gloucester.

Matt is very much looking forward to welcoming and working with new students in the coming academic year.

Mr. Andy Dunn – Guitar and keyboard:

Andy is a guitarist of many years' experience as a live and studio performer, he has performed as a guitarist in bands and as a solo guitarist/vocalist in venues all over the UK, including major stages at Glastonbury Festival, as well as Europe and North America. Andy has wide experience of working in other areas of the music business including live and studio engineering, music production and promotion.

Andy has been teaching in schools and colleges and privately for over 20 years, and in that time has developed strategies to assist and encourage those in the early stages of learning to play as well has helping more experienced players to excel on the instrument.

Students can choose to learn from a range of styles - Electric, acoustic, finger style, plectrum, rhythm and lead, standard and open tunings - and also a range of genres including: Rock, Blues, Funk, Reggae, Classical and Jazz.

If your child wishes to take instrumental lessons, the following charges apply:

- £16.00 for a 30 minute individual lesson, with 10 lessons per term. Total Cost £160.00.
- £8.00 per half hour group lesson (2 in a group), with 10 lessons per term. Total cost £80.00, (please note, PP students pay £20 per term; the balance will be paid by The School).
- Students who take GCSE Music are only required to pay £45.00 per term towards the cost of a group lesson. The balance will be paid by The School.
